



Dr Natalie Ward is a Senior Research Fellow within the Dobney Hypertension Centre at the University of Western Australia and holds Honorary positions with Harry Perkins Institute for Medical Research and the Department of Cardiology, Royal Perth Hospital. Having obtained her PhD in the Medical School at the University of Western Australia in 2004, she then undertook a postdoctoral position at UWA, supported by an Athelston & Amy Saw Medical Research Fellowship, before moving to the University of Massachusetts, in the USA to carry out her NHMRC CJ Martin Fellowship.

In 2009 she returned to the Medical School at UWA and received additional support from a National Heart Foundation Postdoctoral Fellowship in 2010 and a RPH Medical Research Foundation Fellowship in 2012. After taking up a Teaching & Research role in the School of Biomedical Sciences and Public Health at Curtin University in 2015, she returned to UWA in 2021 as a Senior Research Fellow within the DHC.

Natalie's research interests include the pathogenesis of vascular dysfunction and atherosclerosis, lipid disorders and novel treatment options, the role of the gut microbiome in cardiometabolic diseases, and the development and implementation of registries. She is Treasurer and Executive Board Member of the Australian Atherosclerosis Society and a member of the Hypertension Australia Taskforce Working Group on big data. In addition, she is Registry Coordinator for the Statin Intolerance, DHC Hypertension, Primary Aldosteronism and Acute Coronary Syndrome registries.
