Prior to becoming a Registered Nurse (RN), she completed a Bachelor of Science at The University of Western Australia (UWA) in 2014, majoring in Anatomy and Human Biology, as well as Physiology. She subsequently moved to Melbourne to undertake a Master of Nursing Science, of which she became a qualified RN in 2017. Justine returned to her

hometown of Perth in 2018, where she has been involved in the daily running of clinical trials and research activities at Dobney Hypertension Centre ever since. She has extensive experience in coordinating both sponsored and investigator led clinical trials for patients with cardiometabolic disease. As part of her role at DHC, Justine also works closely with Prof. Markus Schlaich and team at the Hypertension Clinic, Royal Perth Hospital, which specialises in the management of patients with difficult-to-control hypertension. Justine was inspired by all the exciting research at DHC that she decided to pursue a Master of Clinical Research at UWA under the supervision of Prof. Markus Schlaich and Dr. Natalie Ward focusing on the accuracy of "office" and "out-of-office" blood pressure measurements in clinical practice, which she completed in 2023.
