



Dr Natalie Ward obtained her PhD in Medicine from the University of Western Australia in 2004. Following this, she undertook her first postdoctoral position at UWA, supported by an Athelston & Amy Saw Medical Research Fellowship, before moving to the University of Massachusetts to carry out her NHMRC CJ Martin Fellowship. Following her return to the School of Medicine & Pharmacology at UWA, she was supported by a National Heart Foundation Postdoctoral Fellowship and a RPH Medical Research Foundation Fellowship. She briefly left to work in the School of Biomedical Sciences and Public Health at Curtin University, before returning to take up a Senior Research Fellow Position in the DHC in 2021. In addition, she holds an Honorary Appointment with the

Harry Perkins Institute of Medical Research. Her research interests include the pathogenesis of vascular dysfunction and atherosclerosis, lipid disorders and novel treatment options, as well as the role of the gut microbiome in cardiometabolic diseases.
